GERMAN OCCUPATION OF NORTH-EASTERN POLAND PREVIOUSLY OCCUPIED BY THE RUSSIANS.

15 Jan. 1916: German Germania Stamps with Watermark Diamonds Overprinted
"Postgebiet / Ob.Ost" in Black Gothic Type (which indicates that the Postal Region and the Military Command Area of the "Ober-Ost" Occupied Territory were not the same. The Polish areas of Suwaiki and Biaiystok and Polish-Lithuanian Wilno (Polish) or Vilnius (Lithuanian), or "Wilna" in German, belonged to the area in which the Ob.Ost stamps have been used. 12 stamps:

Registered cover sent from Warsaw-1 to Berlin-Lichterfelde West on 21.9.18 and arrived 29.9.18. Censored at "Posen" (= Poznań).



16 Dec. 1915: German pre-paid Post Card sent from Zódź to Cassel in Germany (nowadays spelt Kassel, with "K").




28 April 1916: Identical German post card, also overprinted "Russisch Polen", sent from Częstochowa to Hamburg, and also through the German postal censureship office in "Posen" (= Poznań), but this time with the censor's rubber handstamp applied in violet rather than red.



1916 Picture Postcard (ADPL) with date stamp "Czenstochau" (= Częstochowa) 29.8.16, and violet handstamp "Briefstempel 2.Comp. 3.Landst. Inf.Ers.Bat. Mosbach XIV 2", and a censureship handstamp "Mühlhausen / (Els.). The City of "Mühlhausen" in the "Elsas" Province was regained by France at the end of World War I and has remained French except for an interruption during World War II.

The card was addressed to a small town near Mulhouse in Alsace Prov.



1916 Picture Postcard ("Wilna", Polish Wilno or Lithuanian Vilnius: the Kaplica Ostrobramska, or the "Sharp-gabled Chapel"), with a circular datestamp "K.D. Feldpoststation Nr.166" dated 21.1.16.

Wilno was in part of Russia (annexed) that returned to Poland after World War I, but annexed again by the Soviet Union after their stab in Poland's back during the Nazi German attack on Poland in W.W. II. New again the Capital of Lithuania.

7 Jan.1916 (postmark): Card from a Zeppelin Pilot to his family. Sent from Warszawa ("Warschau") to Mannheim showing the Lake in Wilanów by the famous Palace.

1916: Reply to German Pilot in German Zeppelin Air Force Unit in Warszawa. (2):



1 Feb.1916 (postmark): Card sent from Speyer (on the Rhine, just south of Mannheim) to Zeppelin Air Force Unit No.3 in Warszawa, showing the Post Office Square and the Old Gate in Speyer. Both cards free of postal charges, having been sent by Field Postal Service.



Cover sent from Lódź om 5.8.18 to Brühl-Baden (Germany) with two $7\frac{1}{2}(Pf)$ orange overprinted German Germania stamps, and a German censor's rubber handstamp from the "Posen" (= Poznań) censorship office, in red. (See also the German post cards overprinted "Russisch Polen" on a previous page).

LUBOML (A small town 105 km due east of Lublin, and now in Ukraine).

No. 1918: Town Views. Five stamps, designed by Kaper and printed typography by the printing office Union w Padze Czeskiej, on common white or greyish white paper. Perf. 112 or Imperf. Sheets of 11 stamps (2 x 6, with 1 space remaining unprinted. Did not reach postal usage any more.
