WAR PROPAGANDA STAMPS.

The stamps shown in the following collection are not listed in regular catalogues, except the 1943 Governor Frank stamp. This is a pity, because a few have been postally used (rare items, as the dangers involved were great).

Hitler's Head, portrayed as a Death Head: especially the bottom part, which is clearly a skull. Also, "DEUTSCHES REICH" has been changed into "FUTSCHES REICH" ("Futsch" = "Lost, ruined.")

Cover, with a block of 4 propaganda stamps with Hitler's Skull and "Futsches Reich" plus a 4Pf normal stamp, cancelled Vienna-59, 8th April 1943. Although this cover was sent internally in Austria, these stamps have also been used in German-occupied Poland.

Imperf., white paper. Rare on cover.



WAR PROPAGANDA STAMPS.

Anti-Hitler British Propapanda: "FUTSCHES REICH" Hitler skull on Hitler stamps. (Futsch. futsches, is a German colloquial expression meaning "lost, ruined").



"FUTSCHES REICH": Block of 4. Imperforated.

It is doubtful f many of these stamps were ever used postally before the final collapse of Hitler's Nazi "Third Reich". However, these stamps are known from Germany proper, occupied Poland, Ukraine, and even from Israel in its "Interim" formative period immediately after World War II.
