

April 1921 - Thin Wove Paper: Die I (stamp size 28 x 22 mm, the larger size)



There are many subtle differences and irregularities in perforation; also im colour shade.



A variety of stamps with perforations virtually impossible to measure:

20m: brown-red - Second Printing.

April, 1922 - Pelure Paper; Die II (stamp size only 25.5 x 21 mm for Die II of this value).



Note: All stamps shown are Perf. $12\frac{1}{2}$, and it appears that there is little or no variation in the perforations of this printing. Also the Pelure Paper quality in very homogeneous. The only notable difference seems to be in colour shades. The stamps shown have been arranged in dark-to-light order.
