

1926: Post Card (Cp No. 43 I) with pre-printed logr violet stamp and imprint bottom left: P.Z.G. Wi 76 - 10.000.000 - 26. Sent 11.10.26 from Cracow to Freiburg (Switzerland) with extra logr plus 5gr stamps attached (both plate I).



1926: Post Card Cp.No.43 I, but with differing positions of the dots in the Imprint. (Not listed in the Polish Specialist Catalogue).

Letter type also slightly smaller and heavier. Total length of Imprint 352 mm, but in top card 354 mm.

28 Feb. 1927: Remembrance of Fryderyk Chopin (1810-1849), the Composer. Design by Z.Kamiński. Printed type (on plates) by P.Z.G., Warsaw, on chalky paper in water-soluble ink.



40gr. deep ultramarine: Chepim.

Perf. 11³/₄ x 11¹/₂.

Shiny white gum.

Quantity: 3,059,000.

Valid until 30/4/1933.

Exists also imperferate.

10 March, 1927: 60th Birthday of Marshal Józef Piłsudski (1867 - 1935). Two stamps after a portrait by Kożniewski and printed typo by P.Z.G., Warsaw, but first on cylinders and later on plates. Perf. $11\frac{1}{2}$ (25 gr), or $12\frac{1}{3}$ x 13 (both). Two types resulted from the different printing methods:

Type 1: Cylinder prints,



20gr, carmine: Piłsudski. (Iss.10/3/27).



25gr, yellow-brown: Piłsudski. (Iss. 1/2/28).

Type 2: Plate prints.




Quantities (in total): 20gr 72,379,200; 25gr 29,860,000.

25gr, yellow-brown: Pilsudski. (Iss.1932?). Valid until 30/4/33.



Commercial cover sent by Express mail from Warsaw to Cracow on 14.4.1927, using 20gr Pilsudski plus 50gr Eagle in Laurel Wreath of issue 1 May - 1 Oct., 1924.



Cover sent from Katowice 29.4.1928 to Irvington, N.Y., U.S.A., arriving there 9 May 1928, but destination found incorrects at local P.O.

Violet handstamps "Not for Irvington, N.Y."; "Advise correspondents or publication of your correct address"; and "Forwarded".

Stamps used: pair of 25gr cylinder-printed Pilsudski's (Type 1).

3 May, 1927: First Anniversary of Prof. Ignacy Mościcki's Presidency. One stamp, printed typography by PZG, Warsaw, on white, thin smooth paper with

yellow-white gum.

2-pane sheets of 10 x 10 stamps each.



Perf. $11\frac{3}{4}$ x $11\frac{1}{2}$; also exists imperf. Quantity: 10,000,000. Valid until 30/4/1933.

20gr, vermilion: Ignacy Mościcki (1867-1946)

politician (1926-39), President of Poland, prominent chemical technologist, Prof. at the Lwów Polytechnical Inst.

"3 May, 1927: Fund for the State Schools. Two stamps designed by Z.Kamiń-ski, and printed typography by PZG, Warsaw, with a coloured background pattern of wavy vertical lines. Thin white paper, or coarse white paper; gum yellow or clear. Comb perf. $11\frac{3}{4} \times 11\frac{1}{2}$.



10gr + 5gr: purple/green.



20gr + 5gr: indigo/straw.

Youth with a light and inscription "NA OŚWIATE" ("For Enlightenment")

Quantities: 10 + 5gr 2,970,000; 20 + 5gr 2,950,000. Valid until 30.6.34.

27 May, 1927: 4th International Military Medical Congress, held in Warsaw 30.V - 4.VI, 1927. Printed PZG, Warsaw, in typography (25, 40gr), but the logr in lithography. White thin smooth paper. Comb perf. $11\frac{3}{4} \times 11\frac{1}{2}$ (10 & 25gr) or frame perf. $12\frac{1}{2} \times 12\frac{3}{4}$ (40gr). Shiny white-yellow gum.

Portraits showing Dr.Karol Kaczkowski (1797 - 1867), Professor at the University of Warsaw, general, chief physician of the Polish armed forces in 1831. Portrait painted by Jan Haar (\$\pm\$1795 - 1840).

Quantities: 10gr 1,540,000; 25gr 975,000; 40gr 1,019,918. These stamps exist imperforate, but this condition is very scarce.

Valid until 30.4.1933.



Registered cover with special postmark, sent 6.VI.27 from Warsaw to London (arrived 8 June 1927).

28 June, 1927: Transference of Juliusz Słowacki's Remains to Cracow. To honour Słowacki (1809 - 49), the poet and playwright who, together with Adam Mickiewicz and Zygmunt Krasiński, dominated the Romantic movement in Polish literature, his remains were re-interred in the Royal Burial Vaults in the Wawel Castle in Cracow (which is shared by non-royal Polish Greats).

Typography by PZG, Warsaw, on thin white paper. Shiny white-yellow gum. Frame perf. $12\frac{3}{2} \times 12\frac{3}{4}$. Sheets in panes of 10 x 5 stamps.



20gr claret: Słowacki.

Quantity: 10,020,000. Exists imperf.(scarce).

Valid until 30.4.1933.

26 March, 1928: Post Card Cp 48, Henryk Sienkiewicz. Card meant for internal use.



Card off issue Nr. Ia (Imprint M.P.i T. (II-1928) 50.000.000) (with "-", not "." following "II").

Sent from P.O. Przemyślany-b to New York 27.IV.31. Unfortunately folded. Although meant for internal correspondence, an extra 15gr stamp added for use abroad.



Card of issue Nr.VII (Imprint M.P.i T. (VII-1930) 15.000.000). Sent from Lwów to Baden near Vienna, Austria. 2 x 5gr stamps of issue 1 Nov. 1930 added for sending outside Poland within Europe.



Pair of 15gr Sienkiewicz stamps used on what is probably one of the many post cards which were legally printed from 1922 to 1925 without pre-stamped values. Imprint bottom left W.R.K. Not listed in Polish Specialist Catalogue, but on p.210 (Vol. 1) a brief note about such post cards is given.

This card was sent from Ojców (near Cracow) on 18 VIII 1930 to Chicago, Ill., U.S.A. For overseas postage without air transport a total of 30gr was required.
