Registered envelope, sent 5 May 1920 from Cieszyn to Poznań, where it arrived 12 May 1920. Note that the German-and-Polish Austrian postmark has not yet been replaced by a Polish one, although Poznań-3 Post Office had already switched from German to Polish. The sender still used the German version for the addressee's town and street names, as well as the German "Einschreiben" (Register) instead of the Polish "Polecony" (Registered).
